PhD studentship in Developmental Cognitive Neuroscience at the Centre for Brain and Cognitive Development, Birkbeck, University of London.

We invite applications for a three-year studentship linked to a Leverhulme research grant. The project funded by this grant is a 3-year longitudinal project exploring the origins of motor mimicry in infancy, and will follow a cohort of infants across the first three years of life. The project will employ a range of methods including EMG, EEG and fNIRS, as well as behavioural tools, in order to investigate the factors that contribute to the emergence and development of mimicry. The PhD project will specifically investigate how increasing functional connectivity influences the emergence and development of mimicry.

The successful student will be involved in the day-to-day running of the project together with a post-doctoral fellow. This will include design and experimental set-up, testing infants on a battery of tasks using multiple methods, and analyzing complex data sets. The student will also be expected to assist in recruiting and scheduling infants for testing.

The Centre for Brain and Cognitive Development is one of the world's leading institutions for developmental cognitive neuroscience with an international reputation for training and research in functional brain development.
